



Student Code of Conduct

As an online institution dedicated to religious training and education, the Johnnie Colemon Theological Seminary (JCTS) is committed to upholding the highest standards of moral and ethical conduct for all students and persons affiliated with the Seminary.

The Seminary maintains zero tolerance for the following conduct:

1. Dishonesty, including slander, libel, academic cheating, and plagiarism.
2. Bullying, harassment, hazing, assault, battery, or physical or sexual violence, including threatening, abusive, or intimidating language, whether verbal, written, or electronic.
3. Sharing explicit or indecent material, including indecent exposure or the distribution of sexually explicit images, videos, or other media of any person without that person's consent.
4. Theft or property-related offenses, including robbery, burglary, trespassing, and vandalism.
5. Unauthorized use, reproduction, or distribution of copyrighted or trademarked material.
6. The unlawful use, possession, or distribution of drugs, alcohol, illegal substances, weapons, or firearms.
7. Threats of harm or violence, including acts or threats of domestic or international terrorism.
8. Misuse of technology, including the distribution of viruses, spam, phishing attempts, hacking, or other harmful or unauthorized digital activity.
9. Any illegal, unethical, or intimidating conduct that threatens the life, safety, privacy, rights, or well-being of any individual.
10. Conduct that materially disrupts or interferes with the Seminary's learning environment, operations, mission, growth, or reputation.

As a nondenominational institution, we have absolutely no tolerance for anyone being harassed or penalized for their beliefs, appearance, or lifestyle. Our priority is to promote an environment that welcomes all professionals and all legal and ethical perspectives. While it is acceptable to challenge viewpoints within the classroom, all discourse must remain respectful and productive.
